^ Limited Competitive athletes are youth Recreation registrants who wish to compete at the Sadie Caulder Knight competition (i.e., they MUST be registered as Limited Competitive at the start of the season or upgraded in e-Reg prior to registering for the Sadie Caulder Knight Provincial Championships).

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Canada Artistic Swimming and Sask Artistic Swimming will manage the National Registration Database, according to Canada Artistic Swimming and Sask Artistic Swimming Privacy Policies.

CAS e-Registration System (e-Reg)

All members – athletes, coaches, officials, executives, and volunteers – must be registered through the e-Registration System and in good standing to compete in any artistic swimming activity and ensure insurance coverage.

The Artistic Swimming Season

The Canada Artistic Swimming membership year is September 1st to August 31st. As of August 31st, each year, the online e-Registration database will show all members as inactive. **Anyone participating in artistic** swimming activities on September 1st or beyond MUST be registered for the new season in the CAS e-Registration System <u>prior</u> to participation.

Member Club Registration

To ensure Saskatchewan Artistic Swimming collects the relevant and appropriate information from each member club, each club must complete the online <u>Annual Club Registration Form</u>. Annual Club Registration Forms must be submitted no later than **September 1** each year.

Registration and Payment Deadlines

Member Clubs must complete the registration of its members (i.e., athletes, board members, volunteers, etc.) through the Canada Artistic Swimming (CAS) e-Registration System no later than **11:59 PM on October 10** annually.

Member Clubs may add new registrants to the e-Reg System at any time during the season. Individuals must be duly registered with a Member Club **prior** to participating in any artistic swimming activity – in person or virtually – in Saskatchewan. Anyone participating in a SAS sanctioned event or competition – inperson or virtually – must be registered in the e-Reg System **prior** to registering for the event.

Payments of registration batch fees are **due upon submission to the e-Reg System and receipt of the automatically generated electronic invoice**, and **no later than October 15**. Payments can be made to Sask Artistic Swimming via e-transfer or cheque. For e-transfer, please use the email <u>payment@saskartisticswimming.ca</u>. Payments by cheque must be accompanied by the **Payment Summary Form** generated through the e-Reg System. Please refer to Appendix B for direction on generating the Payment Summary Form.

Failure to pay registration fees within **30 days of the submission date** may be subject to fines and registrants may be ineligible to participate in Sask Artistic Swimming or Canada Artistic Swimming sanctioned activities. **After 60 days**, SAS may label a club in arrears as "not in good standing".

The registration of all members shall be in accordance with Sask Artistic Swimming's Member Registration Policy & Procedures

REGISTRATION POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

- **COACHES:** All coaches are required to register <u>themselves</u> in the e-Reg system. Neither SAS nor clubs can register coaches. Coaches who have multiple roles (e.g., officials, athletes, etc.) must register **FIRST** as a coach. All other roles will be considered "additional roles" and the fees will be automatically reconciled accordingly.
- **COACHES:** Coaches **must pay the appropriate fees by electronic means** (e-transfer) to complete their registration. Coaches should seek reimbursement of registration fees from their club, as appropriate.
- **OFFICIALS:** Officials are required to register with Saskatchewan Artistic Swimming directly by filling out an online form (will be sent separately). Officials may not register as an official through a member club.
- **CREATING REGISTRATION BATCHES**: The maximum size of a registration batch is 50 registrants. **Batches can stay open and pending for 30 days** – the system will automatically generate electronic email reminders prompting the Club to submit a pending batch 21 and 29 days after its creation.
- PAYMENTS: The Online Registration system automatically generates an itemized invoice for every registration batch submitted. Automatically generated invoices are emailed to the club contact identified in e-Reg system. Payment is due upon submitting the batch and must be accompanied by the Payment Summary Form generated through the e-Registration System (Appendix B). Registrations are not valid until such time as payment is received, processed, and confirmed in the e-Reg system. Confirmation of payment will trigger the registrant's status to be changed to 'active'.
- **REFUNDS**: No refunds are issued by CAS or SAS once a batch has been submitted.
- **IN ARREARS:** After 60 days, SAS may label a club that is in arrears on batch payments as "not in good standing" in the e-Reg System. This will prevent a club from registering its athletes for competitions. Payment must be received and processed to enable for the status to be updated.
- **COMPLETING REGISTRATION**: Registration is only complete when Canada Artistic Swimming (CAS) receives payment from Sask Artistic Swimming and the individual profile is marked complete.

Fines

Saskatchewan Artistic Swimming will charge fines as follows:

- \$25.00 for per late competitive entry received after the initial registration date.
- \$200.00 for late full club competition registrations received after the initial registration date.
- A change to the initial registration is considered a late registration.

Canada Artistic Swimming rules state: "Late, incomplete or incorrect registrations will result in a \$25.00 penalty fee per competitive athlete up to a maximum of \$500.00 per club." Any Canada Artistic Swimming fines incurred will be charged to the club(s) involved.

Refunds from Competitions

There are **NO** refunds after the registration deadline unless a written request is submitted to the Executive Director. The request must be submitted no later than the Monday after the competition.

TRANSFERS

A Club may not solicit athletes (or the parents of minor athletes) from another club without receiving approval from the head coach who is responsible for the athlete.

There is no formal transfer process in the CAS Online Registration System.

At the start of a new season, Member Clubs are free and able to register new members who were previously registered with another Club without approval from the former club or Sask Artistic Swimming, provided the member is in good standing. If a member's status is not in good standing, a new Member Club will not be able to register the member until the former club or Sask Artistic Swimming have updated their status to in good standing.

For a new club to register a member formerly registered with another club, they will search the database for the member's profile and proceed to register them. To transfer a registered member during the season, the new club will add the new role to the registrant's profile.

Sask Artistic Swimming and CAS fees are non-refundable. All reimbursement of fees from the former club to the transferred member is at the discretion of the former Club in accordance with their relevant refund policy.

INSURANCE

By virtue of membership in good standing with Saskatchewan Artistic Swimming, Members Clubs and registrants are covered through SAS insurance policies. Only <u>activities sanctioned or authorized by SAS</u> are covered.

Insurance coverage extends to all sanctioned activities in Saskatchewan and in Canada. If your club is considering activities outside of Saskatchewan or Canada, the <u>SAS Club Additional Activities and Events</u> <u>Sanction Form</u> must be filled out and submitted to SAS for approval.

Certificate of Insurance

The Certificate of Insurance is proof of insurance coverage and names the appropriate municipalities, facilities, partners, and service providers. If you require a copy of the Certificate of Insurance, please submit your request to <u>ed@saskartisticswimming.ca</u>.

WHAT ARE SANCTIONED ACTIVITIES?

Sanctioned activities are those **approved or authorized by SAS** and therefore those for which members are insured. For insurance purposes, sanctioned activities are those considered usual to the sport such as dryland training, practices, SAS and/or CAS approved competitions. Team building or cross-training activities, such as gymnastic, trampoline, etc., are not usual to the sport and require pre-approval from the SAS insurance carrier.

Unsanctioned activities are not covered by SAS' insurance, and **participation is at the risk of the participant and Club**. Any activities beyond team training with members of the Club and SAS competitions require pre-approval of SAS. If you are unsure about the status of a planned activity, please contact SAS for guidance.

WAIVERS

All Clubs **MUST** adopt and implement the SAS waivers and forms included in links below, or a club developed equivalent that releases both the Club and Sask Artistic Swimming. **All registrants must complete the waivers at the time of registration.**

CAS Online Registration System – Registration Payment Summary Report – Clubs and PTSOs

The Payment Summary Report has been implemented for both clubs and PTSOs to use.

Clubs will use the report to select batches that have been submitted. Along with the payment, clubs will include the report to identify which batches have been paid with their payment.

PTSOs will use the report to select batches and coach/official payments that have been submitted to CAS. Along with the payment, PTSOs will include the report to identify which batches and payment records have been paid with their payment.

On the list of registration batches, a check box will appear once a batch has been submitted that allows you to select the batch for payment. You can select as many batches for payment as you need. When you have selected the batches for payment, you can click the "Payment Summary Report". The report will be displayed with only the batches that you have selected for payment. You can print the report or save it as a PDF. This report should be submitted along with the payment. *USE the back arrow to return to the previous screen.*

NOTE: once a batch has been printed on a payment summary report, an "S" will appear beside the check box. This is to let you know it has already been included on a payment summary report. The "S" does NOT prevent you have selecting it again to include on another payment summary report if required.

For Clubs, once a batch has been submitted (PAYT WAIT status), you can select the batch to include on your payment summary report. If you have multiple batches you want to include, select each batch to include. Then click the payment summary report button.

For PTSOs, once a batch has been submitted (PAYT WAIT (NSO) status), you can select the batch to include on your payment summary report. You can ALSO go to your "Submitted Payments" and select payments that have been submitted (PAYT WAIT(NSO) status) to include on your payment summary report. You can include both batches and payments on the same summary report if you like. Just check the batches to include, go to the payments and check payments to include and THEN click "Print Summary Report". This can be done from either screen (batch or payments screen). Once printed, the "S" will appear beside those already printed. But again, you can reselect anytime.

NOTE: the "Payment Summary Report" button will only appear if there have been batches or payments selected for printing.





Club Payment Summary Report Screens

List of batches for a club, only "PAY WAIT" (payments submitted by club) can be printed on payment summary report. These will have the check boxes beside the "Go" button. You can check these on and off as desired.


